


Prayer of Thanksgiving

And may God be at your side, even in valleys of death.


May Christ Jesus be the cornerstone of your life.

Steve Doherty is currently the Executive Director of Youth Without Shelter. Prior to Joining YWS in 2017, Steve spent over 24 years working in the Children's Mental Health, Addictions, and Developmental Services Sectors. Steve was instrumental in establishing one of the first substance abuse treatment programs for youth which combined mental health and family therapy with a harm reduction model. He has been a sessional Professor in the

Child and Youth Work program of Sheridan College and a regular presenter at provincial and national conferences. He appears regularly on TV and radio discussing mental health, homelessness, and youth issues. A native of Bramalea, Steve received his B.A. from Saint Mary's University in Halifax.
