Biography: Rev. Linda Levin

Linda is from a Jewish family in South Africa. Her first career was teaching Latin and Remedial English, in South Africa and then in London (England). She met and married a Canadian and came to Canada in 1976, when she began studies for ministry at Emmanuel College in Toronto. Ordained in 1979, she served for 2 years in Northern Ontario and 29 years at Runnymede United, Toronto. Linda officially retired from ministry in June of 2011 to start on her third career - to head Village of Love Canada, an organization she founded to support a group of Kenyan women in the slum community of Kibera. Big-hearted women who, despite their extreme poverty, take in and raise AIDS-orphaned children along with their own families. When not supply preaching and volunteering for Village of Love Canada, Linda likes to read or listen to audiobooks (ranging from science fiction to historical novels).
