Place Mary and Joseph on the altar

We pray tonight for those rushing to get to family, for those fleeing violence and war, and any without shelter.

May unexpected comfort find them.

In this story there is no king and no warrior. God comes as a wriggly, wee baby born in a manger.

Place the manger and Christ Child on the altar

We pray tonight for those most in need of tenderness and joy, for the places and spaces that crave the Holy, where there is division and deepest despair.

May unexpected grace enter every aching heart.

In this story, there are angels, an other-worldly lot, brave enough to bring life-changing news—spectacular news—even to those not ready for it.

Place the angels on the altar

In this story, there are shepherds, an odd sort of folk, who know the hardship of life and open themselves to the transformation that this good news means.

Place the shepherds and sheep on the altar

In this story, there are wise ones, strangers who will follow a path unknown, lit only by a star.

Place the magi and camels on the altar

We pray tonight for those who can only dream of equity, justice and peace.

May we be brave enough to believe in transformation and help bring it to birth.

Together with Mary and Joseph, with the angels and shepherds and wise ones, with sheep and cattle and camels, we lift our voices in praise:

Sing this refrain after the choir and after each verse.




We remember:

In this story, a blessed child grows to be our teacher. He draws to himself the unexpected, unrecognized, and unloved. He comes alongside all those made marginal by the empires of this world and risks it all for love and justice. Jesus, who came to be with us, offers a way home to God.

On the night before he was murdered for his extravagant love, he called his friends to the table. He took ordinary things—bread and wine--and he asked his friends to remember. Taking the bread, he held it, broke it, and offered it to them and said: "eat this, and each and every time you do, remember me. My body is broken for you." And then, taking the cup, he held it in his hands, lifted it, and offered it to them and said: "drink this, and each and every time you do, remember me. My life is poured out for you."

Jesus has died. But my friends, Christ is risen, and Christ will come again.

We remember: the God who loved us into being; the Child who came into the world to be with us; and the Christ from whose body hope comes again. We pray that the spirit fills these gifts with comfort and joy, feeding us with the hope that transforms the world.


May you be blessed by the Womb from which the world was born;
