As we prepare to move into a time of new joys and new uncertainties,


what can we use to rest firm in our faith?

But today is not like other days because today we begin our Lenten journey once again.


As we take time over the next five weeks to consider our discipleship and what it means to truly follow Jesus, help us to be mindful that we are all connected to each other, to the earth, and to you.

Our Guest Minister today is Rev. Ambury Stuart

Rev. Ambury Stuart was one of the Presbytery representatives during the amalgamation discussions between Northlea and Bedford Park United, and has remained in touch with the new, combined congregation as an occasional supply worship leader ever since. He was ordained in 2004 after a 30-year career in environmental science and was the worship leader at Glebe Road United in the Yonge-Eglinton area for 10 years before his retirement from active ministry in 2013.

Ambury sees himself as both a scientist and a minister, and his sermons reflect this unusual combination of life-experience. In retirement, he continues to appreciate the opportunity to share his faith and his ideas with congregations such as Northlea. He and his spouse Victoria currently attend Fairlawn Avenue United where he is a Voluntary Associate Minister.
