

Our guest minister today is Rev. Dr. Nancy Hardy

The Rev. Dr. Nancy Hardy has had a number of ministry "lifetimes" in The United Church of Canada. She started out as a diaconal minister, director of Christian Education in Fredericton, New Brunswick. From there, she moved to the United Church's national office in Toronto where she was mission study editor and published books, magazines and educational material about the mission and work of the church.

Nancy was ordained in 1987 and served congregations in St. Catharines, Glencoe and Appin, and London. After she became a United Church pensioner, she moved back to Toronto, a city she loves, and returned to Emmanuel College, earning a Doctor of Theology, focusing on the relationship between the hymns we sing

and the mission of the church. She has published the book Worship in the City: Prayers and Songs for Urban Dwellers, and we will be using some of those prayers in our worship this morning.
