



This morning, we give a warm welcome to Rev. Kerri Hagerman who will be our guest supply minister until Sunday, September 1st.

Kerri was ordained in 2003 and has served congregations outside of Winnipeg and in Brampton. In 2012, she received a Master of Theology in the area of Homiletics, commonly known as sermon preparation. As a result of this, Kerri continues to ponder how the preaching task holds together both gospel faith and social justice.

In 2021, Kerri retired from education after a 28-year career in the high school classroom and at the school board level. During this time, she continued to serve the church by offering pulpit supply throughout the year.

Currently, Kerri is a member of Islington United Church and she delights in singing in the choir. She has a daughter and son both in university.
