What does it mean to be an "ally" to the Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Queer Plus (LGBTQ+) community?

Quite simply put, an LGBTQ+ ally is someone who supports and educates themselves about and speaks out and advocates for LGBTQ+ people and/or community.

Here are some examples of how YOU can be an LGBTQ+ ally:

Listen: Be attentive and supportive as your friend navigates their sexuality. Their journey is complex and may involve changes. Avoid judgment and be there for them during challenges. This journey is tough, and they will need a supporter there for them. Be mindful of awkward situations and don't assume that they're comfortable expressing their LGBTQ+ identity to everyone.

Respect Pronouns: Always use your transgender or queer friend's preferred pronouns and respect their chosen name. Understand that gender identity may differ from birth sex and can include non-binary identities. Ask about preferred pronouns and remember to practice expressing your own pronouns.

Stand Up: You should always stand up for your friend even when they are not around. The only way change can happen is if you speak up. Your friend should be treated with the same respect as you. Moreover, if a business doesn't support your views, you should make a choice with your money on which businesses you support. Engage in respectful conversations when others say hurtful things.

Respect Their Community: Encourage your friend to have LGBTQ+ friends and safe spaces for support and growth. Attend events when invited but respect their need for independent spaces.

Confront Bias: Address your own biases and privileges regarding sexuality. Seek feedback from LGBTQ+ folks on how to be a better ally. Educate yourself through resources and open discussions.

Love them! Embrace and appreciate your friend for who they are. Love and treat them equally among your friends, recognizing the courage it takes to be open about their identity.

By following these examples, you can provide meaningful support and understanding to your LGBTQ+ friends and family.



Postlude

The Affirming Journey at Northlea United

Northlea United's affirming journey began informally more than 8 years ago with a congregational vote to implement an inclusive marriage policy. The formal process of becoming an Affirming faith community began with approval from Council in late 2021. Soon after in December 2021, the Northlea United Affirming Circle gathered for the first time with Stephen Popiel as chair. Donna Rutz, who is the current chair, took on the role in September 2022. To live into the call of being community together that welcomes people of all identities and orientations, Northlea United introduced Pride Sunday several years ago, marked P.I.E. Day in March and held a service in November in honour of Transgendered Day of Remembrance. Northlea continues along the Affirming journey.
