

(The last purple candle is lit.)


The time is now. We need wait no longer.

Invitation

Our Prayer and Story of Thanksgiving

Come and gather around the manger.

We yearn for the presence of the Holy in our lives.

Here is Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Come and join with the angels and the shepherds to celebrate Jesus' birth;

Let us sing with all creation:

Hymn: Go, Tell It on the Mountain (from Voices United 43)

Refrain: Go, tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere. Go, tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born.

Vs. 1: While shepherds kept their watching o'er silent flocks by night, behold, throughout the heavens there shone a holy light. (Refrain)

Jesus came into this world not seated upon a throne or possessing wealth.

He came to be the presence of the Divine with the poor, the forgotten, the marginalized, because the heart of God ached for justice.

Jesus knew what it was like to be pushed away, kept outside of the community, thrown out from places of worship, unwelcome in the corridors of power.

And so he worked, he proclaimed, he healed, he taught; he confronted the powers and principalities that he avails of injustice. He said:

"Love your neighbour as yourself."

"Treat others as you wish to be treated."

He said all the right things, and all the wrong things.

He sought to change all the wrong things.

He made places for those who had no place,

and gave life to those who had been treated as dead.

He used his power to celebrate the presence of God with us.

He used his power to make a place for everyone.

In God's presence, Jesus shared a meal,

a celebration in which everyone had a place and a purpose.

He said, "This is my body":

shared for our living.

"This is my blood":

poured out for our living.

For God reached into the darkness, and brought forth light.

God reached into humanity, and brought forth Jesus.

God reached into death, and brought forth resurrection.

So with the stars and the powers of creation and light we remember:

Jesus the child; Jesus, the faithful; Jesus, the saviour.

Here is our nurture, our redemption, our life, our celebration:

As the Spirit moves within and among us, we discover the holy in the ordinary, for Jesus Emmanuel is God-with-us.

Come and share; come and celebrate this gift of God-with-us. We gather all our prayers and offer them to God, thankful that God watches over us like a mother, and to whom Jesus taught us to pray, saying:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours
now and for ever. Amen.

(The bread is broken.)

The Bread of Blessing.

(The cup is filled.)

The Cup of New Life.

(Congregation comes forward to receive Communion elements.)

Prayer After Communion (said all together)

With open hearts may we now share it with others.

May your joy and love, shared through the birth of a baby in Bethlehem, continue to fill our homes and our world with hope and peace. Amen.
