



# It's A Lenten Bible Study!

Please join Rev. Liz for a six-part Lenten Bible series on Mondays March 17, 24, 31, April 7, and 14 on Zoom from 4:30-6:00 pm. This study will follow Mark's gospel account of Jesus' last week as studied and interpreted by renowned biblical scholars Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan.

Mark's gospel is the only one to follow Jesus on a day-by-day basis during his last week. In their book, <u>The Last Week: A Day-by-Day Account of Jesus' Last Week in Jerusalem</u> (HarperCollins: New York, 2006), Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan point out that Mark's day-by-day journey with Jesus is in keeping with a daily Holy Week liturgy - daily lessons about Jesus' teachings as the action moves inevitably to the cross.

You do not have to read the book to participate in the study. Rev. Liz will send out a weekly synopsis of Borg's and Crossan's chapter for study along with questions for discussion. For more information, please contact Rev. Liz at liz@northleaunited.ca . All are welcome!
