

As a community, we might also consider how we might create an image such as this in and beyond our community, to reflect our hopes for ministry into the future.

The photo is intended to stir conversation and welcome and belonging. However, if possible, please invite conversation and reflection on how this image might invite us, as a United Church, to think in new and renewed ways about who we invite into our community. It is meant to help support our efforts in deepening and broadening our hospitality. Who is missing from our table? What communities might we come alongside? Who could we invite, with humility, but also confidence, to be part of our community of faith?

Finally, the image was created first and foremost to help people outside the United Church come to understand us in new ways, ways perhaps different from current assumptions of a rule-based, exclusive Christianity. Please consider ways in which we can share this image with the broader community whose curiosity might be stirred, and who might seek to explore us anew or again, as they might seek community to broaden and deepen their spirituality.

Resources will continue to be developed on this theme of **A Place at the Table**. Also keep an eye for an interconnected project **#100Tables** which will profile ministries of the United Church across the country



Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever.
